

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE ONLINE PROFICIENCY TEST (ISTEP)

- This document is intended to help you understand how the online ISTEP will proceed. Please read the instructions below very carefully.
- Please follow the announcements on our website (foreignlanguages.istinye.edu.tr) for the class lists and the Zoom links. On the test day, you must join the Zoom meeting for ID checks and approval forms.
- If you do not attend the ZOOM meeting at the time indicated below, your exam will be invalid.

ABOUT ZOOM

- Make sure you attend Zoom with your FULL NAME.
- DO NOT mute yourself on Zoom. Your audio will be periodically checked by the hosts during the exam.
- Make sure your mobile phone is on THE FLIGHT MODE and wifi turned on.
- You have to stay in the ZOOM meeting until the end of the test. If you leave the ZOOM meeting before the proctors tells you that the exam is over and that you can leave the ZOOM meeting, your exam will be invalidated.

DURING THE EXAM

- Make sure you use GOOGLE CHROME.
- If you experience any problems with the page, please try refreshing the page first. If the problem persists, you can contact your proctor through the chat section of ZOOM. Please do not speak during the exam as this may distract the other students in the ZOOM meeting.
- The LMS system records everything you do in the exam. So, electricity cuts, internet connection or system related problems are reported to us immediately. In cases of such problems, everything you have typed will have been saved by the system. You can log in and continue from where you left off.

Test Sections:

Reading 1 (20 points)

- There are 10 paragraphs with 1 question for each paragraph (10 questions in total).
- You have 40 minutes to answer 10 questions.
- Each question is worth 2 points.

Reading 2 (20 points)

- There are 10 paragraphs with 1 question for each paragraph (10 questions in total).
- You have 40 minutes to answer 10 questions.
- Each question is worth 2 points.

Writing (60 points)

- You need to write two essays.
- Each essay should be around 250-300 words.
- You have 100 minutes to write two essays.
- Each essay is worth 30 points.

The test will proceed as follows:

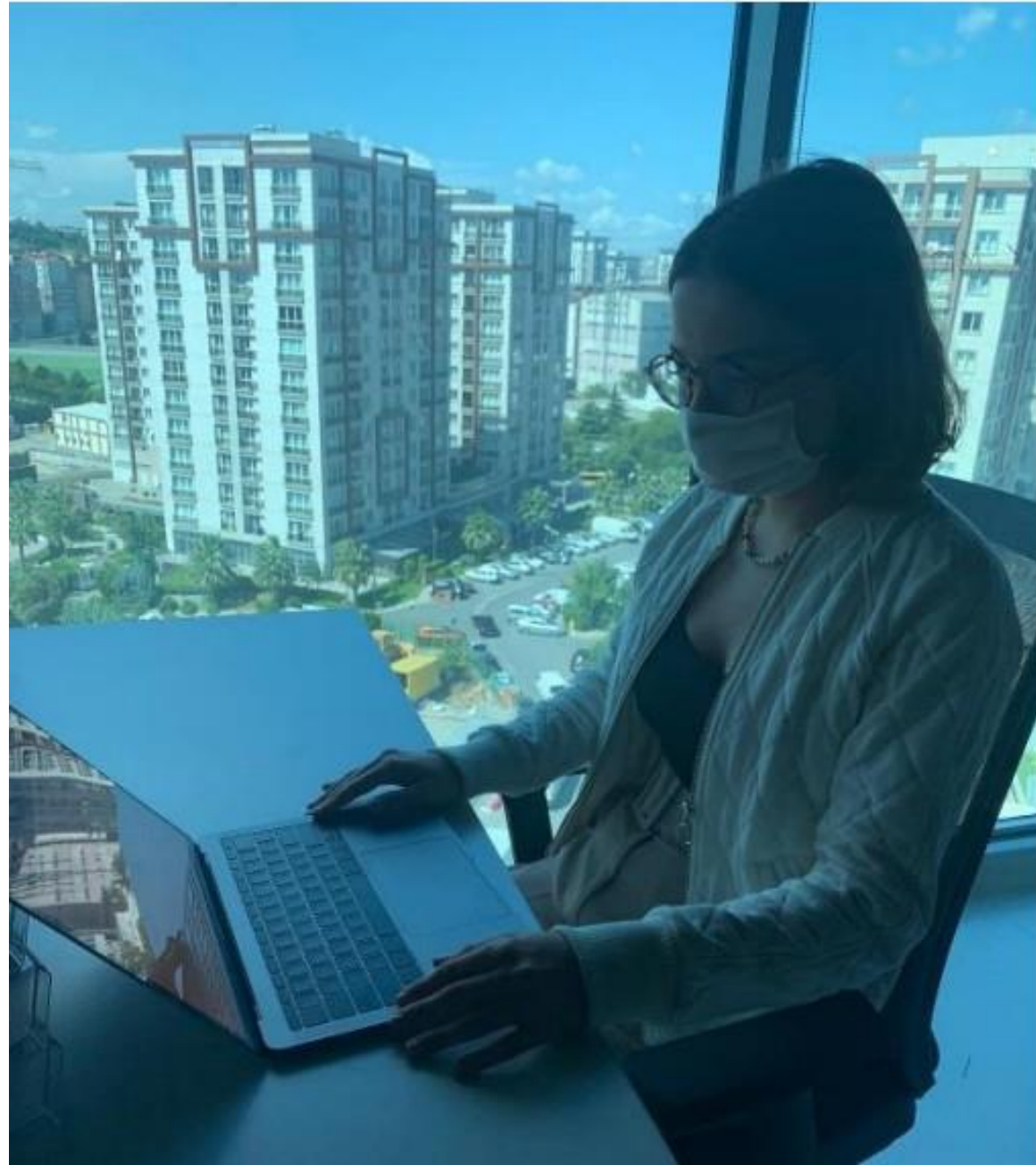
For the WRITING section, you have to attend the ZOOM meeting by 12:30. You will not be admitted into the ZOOM meeting after 12:30.

- Make sure your computer screen does not face the window because the light makes it too bright for the proctor to see your screen.

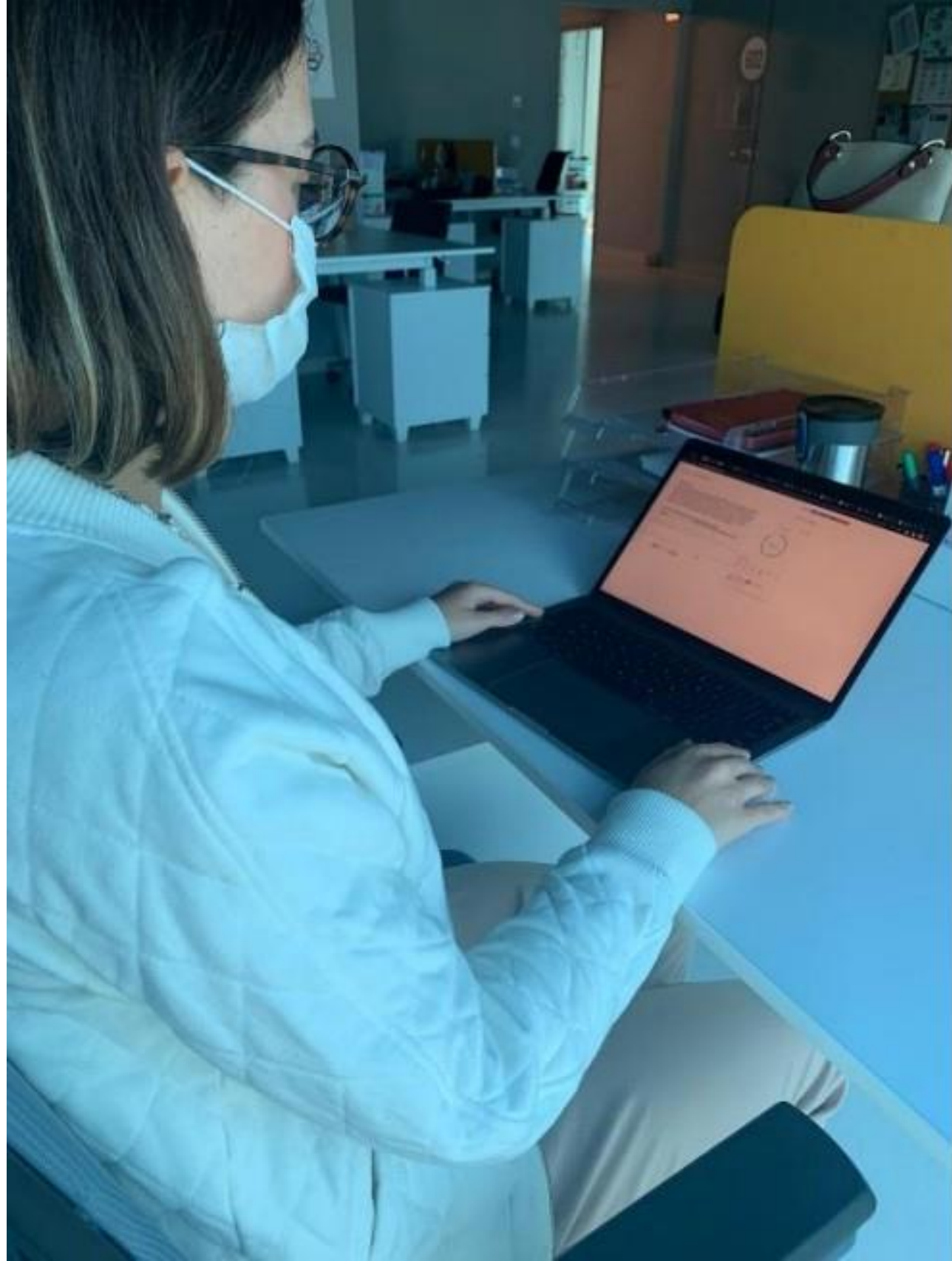





2 Points

Violence

Like all generations, examining the historical time in which a generation grew up explains pervasive characteristics typical to its members. In the US, Generation Z lived through the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001 when the oldest of this cohort were about 5 years old; these attacks then led to the war in Afghanistan. Generation Z has witnessed parents, family members, friends, and acquaintances who have been actively involved in the war. Another cohort-specific experience that has normalized violence is school shootings. 288 school shootings have occurred since Generation Z started school in 2009. Such events directly and indirectly impact them, and this can have advantages and disadvantages. Generation Z can either think of the world as unsafe, or have greater global awareness about what their world is like.

Diversity

A frequently mentioned topic in relation to Generation Z is that of appreciation for () resulting desire for connectedness. Past generations' personas differed based on geographic location but Generation Z, to a great extent, does not. They see the same world events occurring on their TV or livestreamed through their computer or other electronic device in real time. The experience of togetherness has been part of the Generation Z psyche from childhood. From the time they were in preschool, Generation Z have been placed into teams for projects, sports, and much more. Though frequently described as independent and individualistic, research suggests that this generation enjoys working in inclusive teams that ensure no one is left behind.


